On 24 <sup>th</sup> March 1918 he was recorded as missing in action which was when the remnants of the South African Brigade were taken prisoner at Marrieres Wood. His record card then notes 'now wounded and prisoner of war'. He was repatriated on 9/9/18 and immediately admitted to hospital in London. He sailed for South Africa on 9/7/1920 and was discharged as permanently unfit on demobilization in 23/8/1920. A most eventful war. Accompanied by 38 pages of copied research in which his service may be followed in detail. Gilmour was born in Glasgow, Scotland and before the war was employed as a pumpman on the East Rand
